Margot Godbold 1931-2020

Margot Godbold (née Pate) was born in Finchley, North London, on 22nd May 1931 to Haylock and May Pate.

Margot grew up in North London, but during the war she was evacuated to Rodmartin in Gloucestershire where she learned to pogo stick in glamourous surroundings. She came home before the war ended to be with her parents. She combined this North London verve and stamina with a love of home, family and community all her life.

After an early career break from nursing to raise her young family, Margot trained as a teacher. To no one's great surprise her success was immediate, quickly rising to deputy head, then headmistress. Brilliant with young children, fearsomely organised and visionary in her teaching, she was the headmistress and teacher every parent would want for their child



These leadership skills were also evident in her social life, while working, and in retirement with Maurice. The bridge club, Am Dram, WI, village fete and horticultural show (a recent chutney champion) were all very much part of Margot's life in Walberswick, where she made many friends and contributed hugely to the local community. She loved it all.

More than anything, Margot will be remembered as a loving wife to Maurice, to whom she was married for 60 years, a loving mother to Claire and Giles, grandmother to seven and, latterly to her huge delight, as a great grandmother. Her presence was always felt in every room and will continue to be by all she loved and who loved her.

Walberswick Parish Council News Update on Sizewell C

EDF continues to seek approval to build two nuclear reactors at Sizewell. Walberswick Parish Council, at its meeting on 14 December, agreed to submit its response to the latest EDF consultation with regards to possible construction of sea landing facilities, potential increase in rail and other changes to the transport strategy. The Council, along with nearly all other local authorities in the area, remain highly concerned about the impact the development would have on traffic, urbanisation, the environment and coastal erosion over the next 20 years. The response of the WPC can be read in full on the Village Website.

The Bailey Bridge

It is good news from the Suffolk County Council (SCC) that they have recognised the critical importance of the Bailey Bridge to Walberswick and our neighbouring towns and villages. It has committed the funds to do a proper refurbishment of the bridge that should secure its future for at least 30 years. However, the renovation will inevitably mean that the bridge will have to be closed at some point while the work is done. SCC has agreed to include a representative from the Parish Council on an advisory team to provide input especially on the timing of work. When and if this progresses, we will keep you informed. Watch this space.
