Mary King 1931-2021

Mary King (née Wilton) was born in Lowestoft on 11 November 1931, and escaped the bombing of Lowestoft by sleeping in an underground Anderson shelter. After matriculating with top marks, aged 15, at Lowestoft Grammar School, Mary had a successful career as a librarian, obtaining her qualifications in London, where she watched the Coronation Parade in the Haymarket, standing in her red, white and blue ankle socks in the pouring rain. After working at various libraries in East Anglia, Mary became the first mobile librarian in East Suffolk, with a special dispensation to wear trousers to work.

When her relationship with John Miller, whom she married in 1957, broke down, Mary moved to Diss. There she met Peter King and they were married in March 1976. After moving to Walberswick, Mary and Peter ran the Potter's Wheel (now the Parish Lantern) and the shops on The Green. Mary was in charge of the tearoom, which was hard work but she loved it.

Mary and Peter retired in 1987, but sadly, shortly after moving to Dutch House, Peter was diagnosed with Motor Neurone disease and died four years later. Mary became an active fundraiser for the MND Association, holding legendary garden parties every summer and collecting hagstones from the beach, which she left around the village alongside collecting tins. She was always busy, helping with the village fete, second-hand book sales and arranging flowers for the church.

Mary was lucky to have companionship in her more recent years with fellow villager, Grahame Godsmark, and together they shared their love of books, crosswords, holidays in Norfolk and walking Mary's beloved dogs on the beach.



Many years later, the mother of the pupil discovered the book during a clear out and resolved to return it. Enquires and internet searches to locate the headmistress stretched over 20 years but the determined mother was sadly unable to unearth the whereabouts of the headmistress. During yet another tidy up while the pandemic raged, the mother finally came across a village website and information that, for the first time, gave a clue to the headmistresses' whereabouts. Sadly, it was too late to return the book, as it was her obituary that had provided the clue. However, the book was safely returned to her children, and will now be enjoyed by the headmistress' grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Apparently, there has been a good deal of this senseless vandalism at other communities around our area and other beach communities. The police cannot do anything to help if we don't tell them. The Walberswick Common Lands Charity, the Car Parks (WCPL) and the Walberswick Parish Council will stay in communication with each other and the police authorities.

Suffolk County Council wishes to encourage more people to make prompt reports of local problems such as potholes, broken or damaged signs or fingerposts, boardwalk or footpath damage, etc, using their excellent **Reporting Tool** at **highwaysreporting.suffolk.gov.uk**.

Please take a look. The map allows for fast and easy location pinpointing and you can see immediately if a problem has already been reported and when. Please remember to take a photo of the damage which you can then upload and add to your report. The whole process is very simple and only takes a couple of minutes to complete.

Ferry or Walk?

In October 1832, James Maggs recorded in his Southwold Diary (vol 1) that Mr John Cottingham challenged Mr Robert Bird to walk from Southwold to Dunwich in an hour and a half. Mr Jonathan Gooding acted as umpire and Mr Sutherland accompanied Mr Bird on his walk. Mr Bird won the bet, completing the walk in 47.5 minutes. Mr Cottingham thought he would win the bet because he expected Mr Bird to use the ferry to cross the river, which meant Mr Bird would not have walked the entire distance. However, Mr Bird had a range of boats placed across the river to form a bridge over which he walked.




