

### **Parish Council News**

### **Latest on the Bailey Bridge**

The Walberswick Parish Council (WPC) Chair, as delegated by the WPC, is continuing to work with Suffolk County Council (SCC), Suffolk Highways (SH) and others to do all we can to mitigate the impact of the bridge closure. The second opinion engineering report is expected at the end of April/early May. According to SH, there is some risk that this engineer may recommend immediate closure if the bridge is deemed unsafe, but we hope that this will not be the case. Local representatives continue to push for a September closure, while SH maintains that working in the summer months would be preferable.

Once the bridge is closed, mitigation will be around an expanded ferry service, including extended operating hours (early mornings to early evening), a bigger boat and more crossing points. The Ferry Operator has made significant progress by securing a larger boat, investigating additional crossing points, and assessing feasibility. An expanded service will require two crossing points. Initially, the working group looked at a second crossing further upriver, across from the Harbour Master. However, upon inspection of the proposed jetty and pontoon, it is not feasible due to unsuitable public access and a lack of space to queue on the Walberswick side. Therefore, we are now exploring the possibility of having two boats crossing at, or near to, the site of the existing ferry. The working group is also discussing the possibility of a late evening bus to transport diners and pub visitors after the ferry closes.

Assuming arrangements can be made for the expanded ferry service, the biggest issue is cost. In the view of the representatives, unless the crossing is very low cost, existing users of the Bailey Bridge will be deterred. To avoid this, SCC would need to subsidise the ferry service but this is still under consideration. The cost of a late evening bus shuttle would also have to be taken into consideration.

Finally, to deal with the likely increase in road traffic due to the closure of the bridge, as well as an increase in staycations due to Covid-19 restrictions, the WPC Chair is in discussion with, and meeting separately, SH to undertake limited emergency work to control parking and traffic gridlock using additional yellow lines on the Street. In particular, SH are expected to make use of the schematics done by the Walberswick Safe Space Team to consider proposals, on an emergency basis, to put in limited (single yellow) and no parking areas (double yellow) on the Street by the Church and on the approach to and around the Village Hall/Jubilee seat. The Council will continue to provide updates through the Village News and on the Walberswick Website.

### Walberswick Annual Parish Meeting (APM)

This year the APM will be held on Thursday, 6 May, at 7.15pm, remotely via Zoom Video Conferencing. It is a legal requirement for the Parish to hold an APM before the end of May. This is proving difficult for Parish Councils as COVID-19 regulations make it impossible to have a meaningful face-to-face APM before the deadline, yet the Government has also ruled that no Parish Meetings can be held remotely after 6 May. Therefore, following a decision of Walberswick Parish Council and based on external advice, the intention of the Chair and the Clerk is to hold the APM on 6 May before the expiration of the ability to meet remotely. By doing so, the legal requirement for holding an APM can be met. It is the intention, however, to convene another Parish Meeting later in the year when COVID-19 restrictions are expected to have sufficiently eased. This will allow for an actual physical meeting, including presentations by Walberswick organisations, and can be held at the Village Hall as in previous years. ### **Next Parish Council Meeting**



### Heritage Hut caretaker wanted

The Heritage Hut has recently been refurbished to house the Walberswick Scroll, the Walberswick Local History Group archives, and other important village papers. It will be used for meetings and as an exhibition space for local artists and crafts people and will be headquarters to the Parish Council, the Walberswick Common Lands Charity, the Local History Group, and the Scroll Committee.

To ensure it is maintained in the best possible way, we are looking for a local flexible individual who can take on a caretaking role whose duties would include (but not be limited to):

- · general cleaning including internal windows
- · responsibility for handing over the key to hirers
- · monitoring the condition of the Heritage Hut following hire
- · identifying any maintenance issues or defects to equipment
- carrying out routine inspections and testing of emergency systems.

The caretaker will need to supply their own equipment and cleaning products. Expenses will be reimbursed. Ideally, the caretaker will be flexible as to when and how long they are needed. ## **Visitor management in the Fifties**

66 Then as now, many visitors to Walberswick arrived by ferry. They were almost immediately subjected to a management process, as their first task on alighting was to find a way past the riverside geese, whose principal aim in life was to repel boarders at all costs. These fine birds belonged to Ernie Cross (Bob's uncle) and were the last survivors of a generations old Walberswick tradition of free-roaming geese.

Further up the village, visitor control was handled efficiently by Rastas, the Alsatian. This formidable animal belonged to Joan Midwood, who lived at Westons. A master of body language, Rastas would spend hours crouched in the middle of the street with his nose between his paws, as if preparing to pounce. Generally, he didn't care much for anything with wheels, and I remember vividly how much the sight of my bicycle could enrage him on a bad day. David Webb claims fond memories of Rastas, but all I can recall is abject terror. **Ray Easterbrook**
