## Danger on the beach WWII defences

The dangerous rusty metal remains of the World War II defences on the beach are now regularly exposed at low tide and can be a trip hazard for walkers. Of major concern, however, is that they cannot be seen when the tide is higher and are a considerable danger to swimmers, surfers, children playing in the water, etc.

Everyone is urged to be particularly careful when using this stretch of the beach, which lies about 100 metres south of the camp site. The relevant authorities were first informed of the danger two years ago. **Editor**

## The Walberswick King Offa Oak Sapling

In 2015, school children planted acorns gathered from King Offa's Oak, the oldest tree in the United Kingdom and thought to be at least 1,300 years old, possibly older. From the acorns small saplings grew, and thanks to a connection in the village, one of these special saplings has been donated to Walberswick by Windsor Great Park, the home of King Offa's Oak. The ancient oak is named after the Mercian king as it is thought to have germinated during his reign. It has a girth of 11.18 metres and the trunk splits one metre above ground leaving several enormous offshoots. It is 16.5 metres high.

The sapling was collected from Windsor Great Park by Vanessa Tucker, Environmental Stewardship Trustee of the Walberswick Common Lands Charity, who was given a tour of the Great Park, including the King Offa Oak in a section not open to the public, as well as a visit to the Windsor vineyards.

The tree will be planted on the Green at Moorside, bedded in with mulch from Windsor Great Forest to make it feel at home. It will be a fitting commemoration of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III, who last year became The Ranger of Windsor Great Park, seventy years after his father was appointed to the post. It will also be dedicated to the memory of Jayne Tibbles, who served as Clerk to the Walberswick Common Lands Charity for 20 years. **Editor**
